What are the gaps between current and future needs of our Lodge vs. where we are now? What needs will arise with increases in membership? What will the Member of the future be expecting in the way of Lodge services and facilities, or Community and Charitable activities? It's our intent to begin pursuing some of these questions, actively encouraging Member participation in the process. Our collective task? Position the Lodge for future challenges and opportunities over the next ten years.

## Meet Your Officers

### Exalted Ruler Pat Carr

**Pat Carr** retired from the California Department of Transportation in November 2009, having worked in transportation planning and external affairs in the Sacramento, San Francisco Bay and Redding areas. Prior to "Caltrans," Pat spent over 25 years in various managerial and marketing positions with intermodal containerized transportation and aerospace companies (Sea-Land Service, American President Lines, and Honeywell Aerospace & Defense Group).

Pat has held leadership and member positions on various charitable and education-related boards, including: Santa Clara University Alumni Board(President); San Francisco Maritime National Park Association(Trustee); Friends of Whiskeytown NRA(President); Washington World Affairs Fellows; Naval Undersea Museum Foundation(Fund-raising Committee); Lake Washington Schools Foundation(Trustee); Junior Achievement of Greater Puget Sound(Division Chairperson); and, Washington Council for Technology Advancement(Working Group). Pat currently serves on the board of the Lassen Park Foundation, and is an officer in the Shasta Historical Society.

Pat grew up in Shasta County, attending Pine Street School, St. Joseph's School and Shasta Union High School, graduating from the latter in 1962. During summers of his college years at Santa Clara University, Pat worked on trail crew and survey crews in Lassen Park and Shasta-Trinity National Forest. He is a Vietnam Veteran, having served as an officer in the U.S. Army Transportation Corps in both Europe and Vietnam. He holds a Masters Degree in Economics from Washington State University, a Bachelor's Degree from Santa Clara University, and is a fourth generation Shasta County resident. He and his wife, Kathleen make their home in Cottonwood. They have two daughters: Erin Miller, who resides in Draper, Utah with her husband Eric(U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security) and two sons, Joshua and Samuel; and Megan Williams, a high school math teacher residing in Eagle River, Alaska with her husband Nate(also a teacher) and their daughter Cassidy and son Kade.

Pat's interest and involvement in Redding Lodge #1073 has stemmed from his desire to be active in community affairs, as well as an extensive family and personal history with the Lodge, where he served as the first lifeguard/snack bar operator at the "new" Lodge when it opened in 1960. ### SPRING CLEANING?

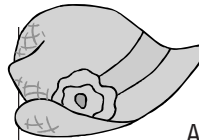

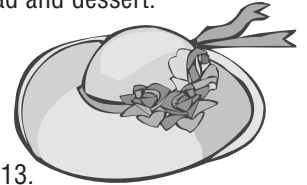

## Texas Hold 'Em

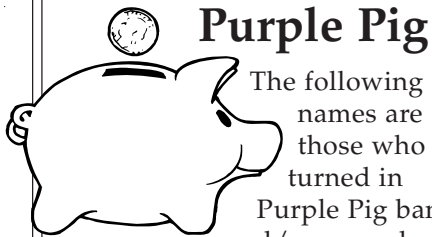
