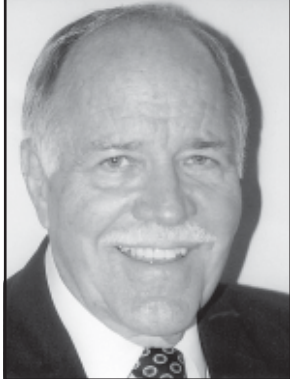

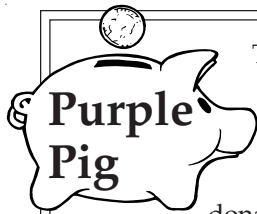

News from Behind the Bar

The Bar would like to announce two new wines that are now available at the Lodge. The first one is a red table wine named "JARHEAD RED". This is a special wine that was originally made by Marines for Marines and the net proceeds of each bottle sold by the Marines provide educational assistance to the children of "fallen" Marines. Recently it was released for general public consumption. "Jarhead Red" is a robust, full bodied Cabernet Sauvignon. It is aged in French oak barrels for eight months. It offers flavors of plum, cassis and black currant with fine tannins on the finish. You are invited to enjoy this wine by the glass for \$3.25 or by the bottle for \$12.00.



Our other new wine addition is actually a substitute for the "HAAS" Riesling that came in the pretty blue bottle that our distributor does not carry any more. We are now serving the excellent "FOREST GLEN WHITE RIESLING". It has floral aromatics and delectable peach and apricot fruit flavor that has a careful balance of sweetness and acidity that keeps the wine clean and fresh tasting that allows it to pair well with all kinds of white meat, fish, cheese and vegetable dishes, even the spiciest ones. The wine sells for \$3.00 per glass and \$10.00 per bottle.

To assure you, the Elks consumer, both these wines were tasted and approved by a very selective panel consisting of seven ELK wine experts on a Tuesday morning. Okay, maybe Darlene isn't an expert but she drank it anyway. Come and enjoy these two exciting new additions to our bar wine menu.

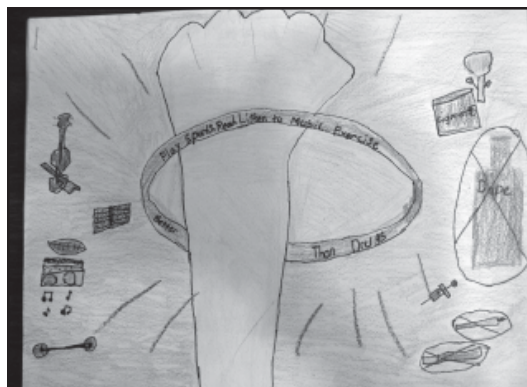

Drug Awareness News

Elk Year-End Summary of Drug Awareness Activities

We are off to a bad start! we were barely into the New Year when we heard about a 17-year-old young woman who drank enough vodka to fatally poison herself. Representing the Elks Lodge as your Drug Awareness Program Chairman, I am a member of the Shasta County Injury Prevention Committee; each month I am reminded about the various negative impact situations our youth are being exposed to. It serves to strengthen my resolve to do what we can to help so I have proposed to the Trustees that we increase and dedicate funding towards the Lodge's Drug Awareness Program.

During the year 2008 we sponsored or participated in the following events: **Volunteer Recruitment Drive; Every 15 Minute Program** to reach high school students about driving under the influence; **Teen Center Battle of the Bands and Basketball Playoffs; Peer Courts; Red Ribbon Week Drug Awareness Program; Teen Party House Program; Teen Haunted House; Shasta County Injury Prevention Council; and Drug Awareness Poster and essay contests.**

We have invested \$700 Elks dollars, \$250 Emblem Club dollars and an additional \$1700 dollars from private donations and matching funds from businesses. Elk Members have donated over 300 hours; and non-Elk members have donated over 150 hours; Emblem Club members have donated over 50 hours. We have driven over 900 miles in support of these programs.

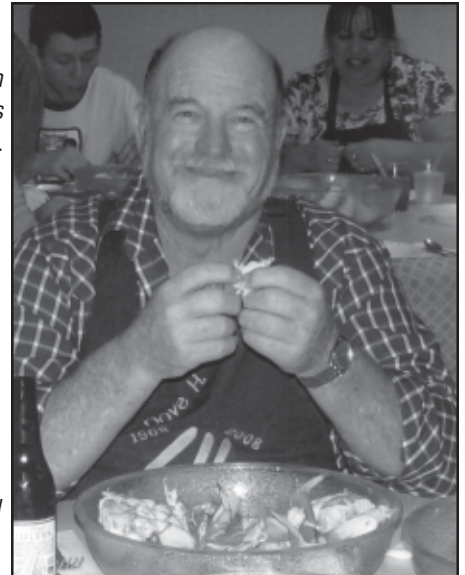
But most important, we have reached over 10,000 parents, teachers, students and community members to tell them that **ELKS CARE – ELKS SHARE.**


