The CHEA State Convention has come and gone. This year, the convention took place in San Diego where **Hugh Scanlon** from Glendale Lodge #1289 was installed as our new CHEA State President.

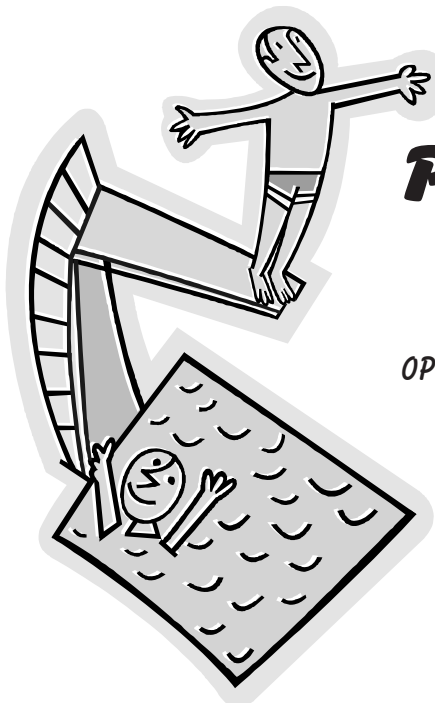

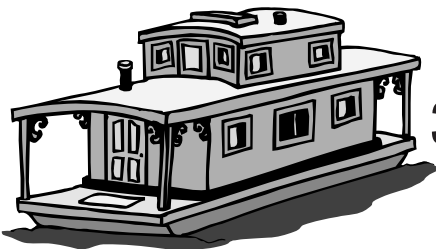




Redding Lodge Ritual Team Takes 1st Place in the North Dist. Ritual Contest

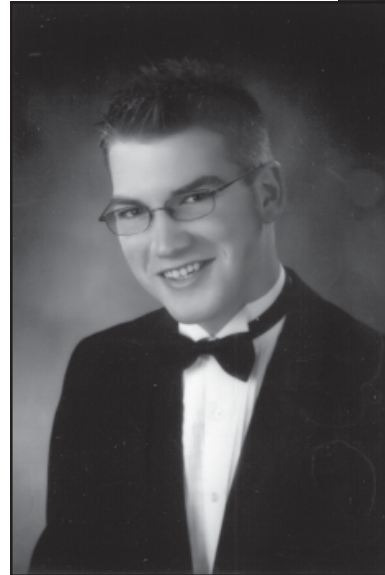

The Committee has elected to award two Scholarships this year due to the increase in the amount of contributions. Donations can be made with your dues payment as well as in remembrance or testimonial.

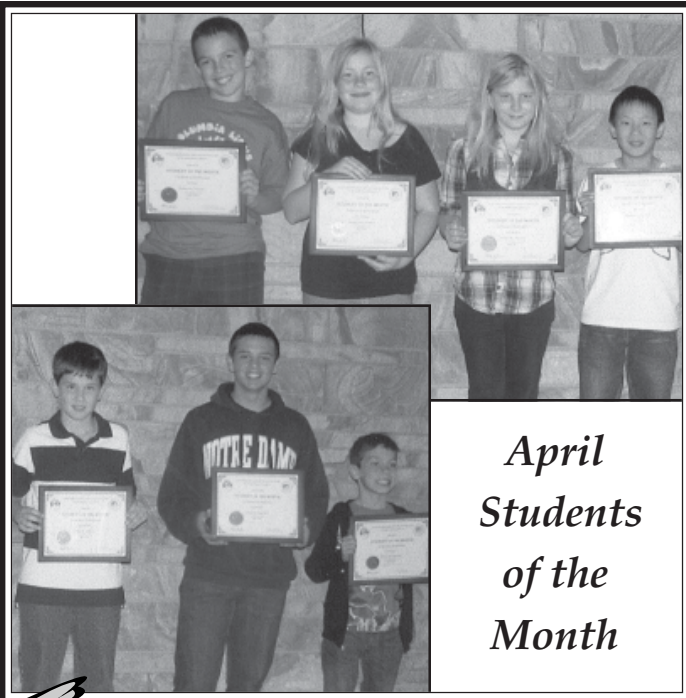

Sunday—12:00 NOON to 7:00 PM

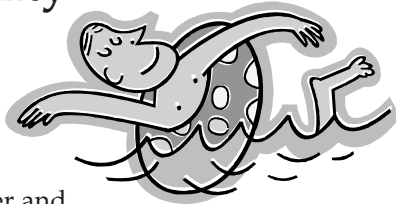
Note: Pool hours are regulated by when the Bar is open, including no use of pool while Thursday Lodge meetings are in session.


